### Supplies:

- 1/4 yard muslin
- 1/4 yard material
- (2) black 5/8 buttons
- DMC floss 310 black, 902 burgandy red
- Barn red Delta Paint
- Stencil brush
- Small 2 inch basket

Tiny flowers for the basket  
Red Heart light and lofty yarn Burgandy red  
poly pellets or kitty litter

## Sweet Annie

Thank you for purchasing a MAMA WSCREATIONS pattern.  
With God All Things Are Possible.

Please read all Instructions first before begin.

### Body~ Arms~ Legs~

Trace pattern on double muslin. The traced lines will be your sew lines.

Sew the body the whole way around. Do not turn yet!

Match the bottom seam to the side seam and sew across the little triangle 1/2 inch in from the edge. Repeat the other side. This is boxing your seams for the body so Sweet Annie will sit nicely.

Make a small slit in the back of the body for turning. Using a light box or light from a window trace the nose, mouth, and eyelashes on.

Fill the bottom of the body with poly pellets or kitty litter about 1 inch and then stuff the rest of the body firmly. Slip stitch the opening closed.

Sew and turn the arms, and legs and then stuff. Attach the arms and legs to the body.

### Face~

Satin stitch her nose with no. 902 burgandy red floss. Place her eye buttons on with 310 black floss then her lashes. Back stitch her mouth. Stain your doll with your favorite staining method. I like to use coffee and vanilla, and place her in the sun to dry or dryer, or in the oven at 200 degrees., but please watch her closely so she doesn't burn and catch on fire!

When she is dry add color to her cheeks using a stencil brush and a little bit of Barn Red delta paint. Dry brush her cheeks in a circular motion lightly.

I use my stencil brush too for the stripes on her legs.

### Dress~

Lay the pattern bodice on double folded material and then cut. Sew in from the edge 1/4 inch the arms, and then the sides. Cut 5 inches by 18 inches for the skirting from the material. Sew the seam together. Machine gather the skirt and then pull the strings to gather the skirt and ease it onto the top of the dress and pin. Sew the two together. Run a hand gathering stitch around the top of the neckline and then tie in a bow. Use matching color of floss for this.

### Bloomers~

Cut 12 inches by 4 1/2 inches and sew the seam. Center the seam in the back and then find the center and sew up 2 inches, pivot across 2 to 3 stitches, then sew back down. Trim inbetween the stitches and then turn. Hand gather the waist and then put on your doll and tie.

### Hair~

Cut a piece of cardboard 3 inches. Wrap yarn around the cardboard 5 times. Tie in the middle and do not cut the ends. Make 5 of these. Sew the yarn hair onto the doll starting at the top.

Cut a 2 inch by 5 inch strip and tie in the middle for a bow. Sew it in the middle of her head.

Place a little 2 inch baskets in her hand and glue some tiny flowers in it.

That's it!!! Enjoy
